Erita is a cheerful mother, who takes her time to teach the older girls to do their own laundry, mend their own clothes and knit hats and scarves. She encourages the boys to be helpful around the home by weeding, watering the flowers, feeding the chickens, helping in the garden and doing dishes - especially their own porridge plates!

Erita enjoys instilling self-confidence in children by talking positively to them and asking them to lead daily devotions. She also involves the children in decision-making in the house, and encourages them to attend church and youth meetings. Erita makes sure all play their role in the KCV family.
