10 Ways to Love Your Neighbour:

3rd July, 2016

Invite one neighbour over for dinner each month.

If someone is new in town, invite them to join your plans for the weekend.

Organize a walking group or running club.

When someone tells you they have an upcoming job interview, a test, or a doctor appointment, mark it on your calendar. Follow up on the big day with a note of encouragement to let them know you are praying for them, or ask them how it went afterward. Better yet, do both!

If you see someone moving in, bring them dinner, a cake, or basic supplies they might need before they unpack, like paper towels, toilet paper, and coffee.

Ask your neighbour to be their friend on Facebook. This is a great way to find common ground and things to talk about the next time you see them.

Practice random acts of kindness. Take your neighbour's rubbish out, or put their rubbish bin away after pick-up. Mow their lawn "just because."

Use your kids as an ice breaker. Invite a fellow mum and her kids over for a play date and get to know her over afternoon tea.

Get outside the walls of your house. You'll meet people as you walk the dog, take walks, work in your yard, or play with your kids at the park. Don't just wave; be intentional about saying hello and getting to know them.

The Parable of the Good Samaritan

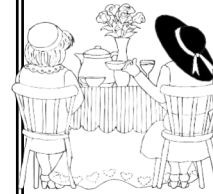
